ROLE OVERVIEW

The Role

Rounders England has a Board of up to ten members led by the Chair. The Board has overall responsibility for the performance of Rounders England and concerns itself with leading the organisation focusing on strategy, governance, finance and oversight of delivery. Directors must be transparent in terms of any interests that might appear to influence their opinions, and must take responsibility for the opinions and recommendations they make.

Role Purpose

To work collaboratively with the Board in helping to create and oversee a strategy for a sport that reflects society and the way people approach sport and recreation today.

Non-Executive Board members are accountable to the members and responsible for using their skills and experience to help Rounders England achieve its aims. Non-Executive Directors form part of the Board and work collectively to make recommendations and decisions to ensure Rounders England is able to develop and deliver its strategy.

- To aid high quality strategic thinking of the Board and provide appropriate support and direction to the team

- To help engage stakeholders and key partners behind our strategy; to act as an ambassador for Rounders vision
- Accept responsibility for the organisation and ensure it operates in an ethical way
- Protect the future of the sport and aid in the financial sustainability of the NGB
- To guide decisions on the strategy, future policy and business management of the organisation
- Monitor performance of agreed plans and strategy
- To participate and contribute to four Board meetings per year and sit on any relevant/ associated sub committees
